

Protest Choice Board: Option 3 The Internet Is An Ocean of Ideas

Not all activism comes from in-person demonstrations. Intellectuals and think-tanks form an important role in educating and inciting political action. Think about the individuals that wrote hundreds of books to increase awareness of events and situations. In the modern world, individuals and groups use blogs, podcasts, and YouTube collaboration to promote political awareness. If possible, email or call activists and ask to conduct an interview with them (do not be afraid to reach out to those with conflicting opinions. Hold a debate with them instead!).

Sourcing	Student uses at least 3 sources with at least two considered a primary source.	Student uses 2 sources or three sources with no primary sources.	Student uses 1 or less sources. 0 points for no primary sources.
